





From pain to hope - A story of survival

It was the 6th of July, 2017.

Sorrowful faces, numbed hearts, yet carrying unshaken hope and tireless expectations, the sister who has been a pillar to the family and the aunt who has been often called as the second mother, walked for the twentieth day without fail, without weariness, towards the Intensive Care Unit [ICU] of the hospital.

But strangely, that day, the mother's heart refused to step into the ward to see her child.

Which mother would ever want to see her sixteen year old daughter in such a condition? Especially when that daughter was her whole world. It was unbearable even to imagine.

This totally unexpected incident had shaken a family that was built on love. It drowned them in grief from which they could never recover. It brought sorrow not only to them but also to everyone who heard about it.

The ICU itself was a frightening place, yet during those days it had become almost familiar to them. Tubes for injections, medicines, oxygen to ease breathing, along with the hopeless words from doctors, and above all a young girl

lying unconscious... It made the situation heartbreaking. Then, suddenly, The nurses, who had only delivered bad news for twenty long days sai d something completely different "Today, your daughter opened her eyes and smiled." a nurse said.

Those words poured like honey into their ears. The moment they were longing had finally come. Tears of joy flowed unknowingly from their eyes. They immediately rushed to call the mother inside.

Hearing this, everyone rejoiced. Her cousins were the happiest. One of them shouted aloud, "Our child has opened her eyes!" His joyful cry moved everyone around. That young girl, in those days, had become everyone's child. Some were sobbing on the sofa, overwhelmed with happiness. In that moment, everyone's faces shone with joy.

Even the doctors were stunned and admitted, "This is a pure miracle! We've never faced a situation like this."

And yes, that sixteen-year-old girl who was in the ICU, is me.

I was just an ordinary girl with tons of hopes and d

dreams. After passing my
Ordinary Level exams with
flying colours, I had just begun
my higher studies. But I never
knew that a simple sore throat
infection, which grew severe
and left me breathless, would

shatter me and my dreams into pieces.

But today, as I am writing this, I see my journey not as an ending, but as a beginning. I am still working on myself too, taking one small step at a time. Some days are harder than others, but every little step forward is still progress. And that is enough.

Same as mine, I am sure each of you has your own stories of struggle, of strength, of falling and rising again. What unites us here is not our failures, but our courage to continue despite them.


So, whenever life places obstacles in your path, remember some beautiful miracles do happen, and strength always grows in places where we thought we were broken.

Work Hard, Take chance! - An interview with Dr. Sanjiva Weerawarna (Founder of Avinya Foundation)

Q: What inspired you to create the Avinya Foundation?



I have always been deeply interested in education. After completing my degree, I spent many years teaching. At the same time, I wanted to find ways to improve Sri Lanka. One of the biggest challenges in our country is that many people feel they don't get real opportunities to move forward. Our school system works for some, but if a student isn't ready at a particular stage, the system doesn't usually offer a second chance.

The goal of Avinya is to make education more accessible to everyone. And by "education," I don't just mean academic knowledge but also skills and practical learning that can help people shape their own futures.

Q : Can you tell us a bit about your own experience as a student?

I studied in different places. I started at Royal College in Sri Lanka. Then, because my father was working in Oman, I studied there for about six months. After returning to Sri Lanka, I continued at Royal and later

studied in India at two different schools. Eventually, I went on to university, where I completed my bachelor's, master's, and PhD in Applied Mathematics and Computer Science.

Q: What was your university experience like?

University isn't just about mastering a subject. It's really about learning how to learn. For example, in Mathematics, even if you spend four years studying it, what you know is still just a tiny dot compared to the vast knowledge that exists. University teaches you to accept that you don't know everything, and that's okay. It's also a time of personal growth. Most students leave home for the first time, learn to live independently, and mature as individuals. That experience is just as valuable as the academic side.

Q: What is your biggest dream for Avinya in the next five to ten years?

From the beginning, Avinya was designed to support students who don't fit into the traditional system. There will always be students who, for various reasons, don't make it through. My own father is a good example. He lost his father when he was very young and had to leave school. But later, he studied City and Guilds, became a radio technician, and eventually served in the army for 30 years.

Avinya's message is that just because you didn't do well at 14, 15, or even 20, your life isn't over. You still have opportunities. That's why our tagline is "Giving Hope." Our long-term vision is to expand Avinya so that one day there will be an Avinya in every divisional secretariat in Sri Lanka.

Q: Where are you planning to open the next academic program in Sri Lanka, and what kind of a place would that be?

We have found a place, but we're still fine-tuning the model. At first, we thought of running a two-year program, but we realized many students couldn't afford to stay that long. So we reduced it to one year, and now we are experimenting with sixmonth programs.

Running Avinya is like building a product for a market. Here, the "product" is you, the students. The "market" is employers. If we do our job well, employers should be eager to hire you. Once we're confident about that "fit," we'll expand to more schools.



Q: You've had a very successful career in IT and business. What advice would you give students who are still figuring out their careers?

Success shouldn't be defined only by money or how big your company is. True success is being happy with who you are and what you do. I know people who earn modestly but are very happy with their lives, and that's success too.

For example, I met a cab driver recently. He has failed his OLs, and he runs a cab service and owns a plantation of his own. He's very successful. He's very happy. There's another tuk guy that I met. He rides a tuk. He has a family. He has a daughter, and he's very happy. So my thing is, don't try to find success in terms of somebody else's mission. Success is your mission.

My advice is: don't chase careers just because they seem profitable. Find what you're good at and what excites you. If you wake up in the morning eager to do your work, then you're on the right path. That's why we designed Avinya to be open, welcoming, and different from traditional schools. It should be a place you want to come to.



So, figure out what motivates you, pursue it with passion, and define success on your own terms, not someone else's.

Q: Can you tell us how you keep yourself motivated when you feel down?

Everyone faces challenges. No exceptions. Even world leaders and powerful figures have hard times. As the saying goes, "When the going gets tough, the tough get going."

Being a leader means facing difficulties head-on. It's not just about leading during good times. Every problem should be seen as an opportunity to ask: Why is this happening? What can I learn from it? How can I solve it?

Life will never be free of problems. Being an adult simply means managing an endless to-do list. The key is to keep going and focus on the bigger purpose behind what you're doing.

Q : How can students like us get the best out of our time at Avinya?

You get the best out of something by giving more than what's expected. For example, if class starts at 7:30, come by 7:15. If it ends at 4:00, stay until 4:30. Don't just do the minimum. Do the maximum.

Take advantage of your teachers, the environment, and the resources around you. One key thing is English. The only

way to improve is to use it daily, not just when you're forced to. Speak to each other in English, even with friends, so you build confidence

Q: What qualities do you believe students need in the 21st century?

The fundamentals haven't changed: curiosity, long-term thinking, creativity, and attention to detail. Our ancestors in Sri Lanka built amazing irrigation systems that we still admire today. That came from curiosity and innovation.

Of course, every era has specific skills. Today, you need English, technology, and the ability to use tools like AI. But the most important skill is continuous learning. Knowledge changes rapidly, so you can't ever stop learning.

Q: What is your proudest moment?

I don't really think in terms of "proud moments." Life is a journey with ups and downs. Achievements like finishing a PhD or building a successful company felt less like grand victories and more like anticlimaxes, because after each milestone, you realize you have to start the climb again. For me, it's not about a single peak. It's about constantly improving, step by step. I don't focus on one "proud" moment. I focus on the journey.



Q: If you could go back and give advice to your younger self, what would it be?

I would say: always think long-term, work hard, and take chances. I didn't come from a wealthy background, but I took every opportunity that came my way. Many people miss chances simply because they don't take them. One way to create opportunities is by volunteering. When you step up, people notice you, and that leads to new chances. Even something small like taking responsibility for keeping a space clean can open doors. The key is to show initiative and create your own opportunities.

Warakagoda Echoes Of a Royal Past and Sacred Harmony

NestledintheserenelandscapesoftheMadurawala Division in Kaluthara district,Warakagoda stands as both a living village and a keeper of centuries-old secrets. Once part of the lesser-known Warakagoda regional kingdom, it served as a power center under the broader pasayoyona realm during the Polonnaruwa period.

Excavations have unearthed ruined foundations reminiscent of royal fortifications and stone pillars etched with ancient inscriptions a whisper of its regal past. At the heart of Warakagoda lies the Gallena Rajamaanha Viharaya, a testament to architectural resilience and spiritual design. Carved into rock, its twin shrines inner and outer guard a sleeping Buddha statue of astounding size and historical depth. Crafted from clay and conserved with lime mortar in the 1800s, the statue presides

over murals painted in 1946, imbuing the temple with both serenity and artistic heritage.


The Sri Lankan government recognized the temple significance, granting it protected status through Gazette notification in 2002 and 2016. Scattered across the village are other sacred sites - such as the Ganeuda Puran Viharaya,

Wehersgodellwatta chaitya.and related archaeological remnants with stone pillars, flights of stairs, and inscriptions added to the tapestry of Wareakagodas heritage

What makes Warakagoda truly expectational is not just its monuments, but its living community. Sinhalese and Hindu residents share traditions and spaces in harmony, weaving a cultural mosaic that fosters preservation and pride in the area's storied past.





Burn the midnight oil - An interview with Mrs. Fernando

Q : Could you tell us a little about yourself?

I studied at a convent girls' school in Gampaha. Then I went to the University of Peradeniya for my first degree. Later, I completed postgraduate degrees and diplomas in Colombo, earned a Master's in the UK, and studied education project management in the USA. All this was possible because whenever I got even a small opportunity, I did my best in that position. So my message is: when opportunity knocks, seize it. Don't let it go. Make it beneficial to yourself and to society. I worked in government service for about 20 years, always in English education. Later. I worked with the US Embassy and an Australian university. I worked until I was 81. Now I am 83, and I am still happy to come to Avinya and offer some guidance.

Q: How did you feel when your son first shared the idea of Avinya?

I felt very happy. We have always loved to do charity whenever we get the chance. My husband and I worked very hard to educate our three children. Sanjeev, my second child, believed that education should not only uplift our family but also the whole community. So he and I spent many hours together planning. We wanted to help young people who had failed or only partly passed their O/Ls, and who were not strong enough for A/Ls or employment. We thought, let's empower them. That was the beginning of the project.

Q : As a mother, what did this initiative mean to you?

I felt very appreciative of the venture. If we have something, we must share it. As a mother, I felt we had given our children a strong message: we can't grow up alone; we have to link up with our community and live in peace and harmony. Sanjeev has that spirit of sharing and caring in him. I am not proud; I am humbled by what he has done.



Q : As a teacher, how do you see the English program at Avinya?

I assisted with a curriculum revision last year and trained the teachers in December and January. The new curriculum places a strong emphasis on English reading, writing, and speaking. However, I feel there is currently more focus on reading and writing than on speaking. There are not enough opportunities for conversation, debates, or discussions, which is a concern for me. Many students are hesitant to speak

English; they sometimes hide behind others or encourage someone else to speak on their behalf. Even those who can speak English occasionally translate for their neighbors. This habit can hinder language development, so it is important to address it.

Q: What improvements have you noticed in the students?

I have seen greater confidence in how students carry themselves—how they walk around without fear and how they interact. However, interaction among students is still inadequate. Some hide themselves instead of opening up. I believe that when we redirect the teaching program, learning outcomes will improve. The students are intelligent, but they need guidance to bring out their talents

Q: What do you think is your biggest achievement in life?

Becoming an important English educator, and the success of my children. I didn't really teach them, their school teachers did. At home, I only helped sometimes. We just opened a window for them; they made it a door. That is my achievement—that they worked hard and found their own path.

Q: What advice would you give students as they graduate from Avinya?

Avinya has shown you ways of self-development. Continue those. Use your computers for research, read newspapers, talk with friends, and use all your contacts to gain more

knowledge. Don't sleep ten hours; sleep only five hours. Burn the midnight oil. Read, read, read—with eagerness. Improve your knowledge and share it with others.



Q : Do you have an inspiring story for young people?

Yes. I heard a young man say, "We had only a mud wall, one room, no land, no computer, no phone,nothing. But I had a dream." He studied at his village school, passed Grade 5, went to a bigger school, and finally to university. His message was clear: if you have a dream and work hard, you can achieve it.

Q : How should students keep learning and growing after Avinya?

Use all the resources available—teachers if you have them, computers, newspapers, radio, and phones. Research the topics you are interested in. If you want to be a construction

engineer, research that. If you want to be a marine engineer, research that. Knowledge is the key. Without knowledge, what can we do? So, stay ahead with knowledge.

Q: What is your final message for young people?

Work hard. Be strong. Reduce your sleep and increase your intellectual engagement. Whatever job you do, do it well. Whatever you study, do it well. Time never comes back, so don't waste it. If you get even a small chance, take it. Keep sharpening yourself and learning more. Opportunity comes,but you must be read.

I am deeply grateful to Dr. Sanjiva, who made these possible words, and I can't express my gratitude.




















Voices of Students - An interview with Students























Small Steps Lead to Great Success



Clear Vision and Target in Mind - An interview with Mr. Madhawa

Q: Can you tell us about your journey and how you became the Head of the Customer Care Center at Sampath Bank?

I started my journey at Sampath Bank as a school leaver after studying at Kearney College and Mahanama College. Through the Mahanama job bank, I applied and was the only one selected out of about

t 50 candidates, which motivated me to do well.

I worked in the Human Resources Department for many years, handling recruitment, performance management, rewards, and training. Later, I became Manager of Learning and Development before moving to the Customer Care Center in August 2021.

I first worked under Mr. Nalaka de Silva and, after he moved to another department, I was appointed as the Head of the Customer Care Center.

My 21-year journey, starting with no experience, was strengthened by my HR background, which helped me connect with people at all levels. Today, I am proud to serve as Head of the Customer Care Center.

Q: What are some of the biggest challenges you've faced in your role, and how did you overcome them?

One of the biggest challenges I faced was moving from an HR background into the operational environment of customer care, which was very different. I had to learn new procedures and branch banking knowledge.

With the support of my management team, especially the former Head of Customer Care, I was guided in unfamiliar areas. At the same time, I applied my HR skills, handling people, knowledge, skills, and attitude, which helped me in my new role.

In banking, customer care and service go hand in hand. A banker is like a financial doctor, helping people with loans, financial support, or other life needs. Key skills include empathy, listening, analytical ability, and providing fast, effective solutions.

What role do you think technology and AI will play in the future of customer service in banking? Sampath Bank, guided by the vision of our new Managing Director, is evolving to be an IT-driven bank while keeping personal customer service. The bank has always been a step ahead, introducing innovations like ATMs, technology-driven banking, and touchless cash withdrawals.

With rapid global technological changes, customer service will increasingly use technology to provide faster, more accurate service while freeing time for meaningful interactions with customers. Al and automation may handle routine tasks like verification, allowing staff to focus on advising customers, offering products, and maintaining personal warmth.

The future of banking customer service will blend technology and personal touch, enhancing both efficiency and customer experience.

Q: How do you manage and motivate your team, especially during stressful situations or peak times?

Stress and pressure are natural, but the key is to maintain peace of mind. As leaders, we play many roles, father, husband, son, friend, and it's important to balance them. In the corporate world, deadlines and targets create pressure, but we should not pass that pressure to our subordinates. Instead, we need to analyze the situation, prioritize tasks, and manage step by step. A good leader absorbs pressure, keeps focus on goals, and motivates the team without transmitting stress. By doing so, even in difficult times, you can remain successful and balanced.

Q: How do you balance professional success with personal life and well-being?

Balancing professional and personal life in customer service is challenging because it is a 24/7 role. I believe we must give back to the organization more than we earn, and to balance life, I use the "switch on, switch off" method.

When I am at work, I leave personal issues aside, and when I go home, I leave office problems behind. This way, I can play my role fully at work and also be a loving father at home. The key is to work happily, go home happily, and maintain peace of mind through this switch on, switch off approach.

Q: You selected 10 interns from Avinya Academy, what qualities did you look for when choosing us?

At Avinya Academy, the first thing we looked at was your knowledge of customer service and how you could handle customers as front liners, even if you were in back office functions. We focused on your knowledge, skills, and especially the right attitude.

Never Give up on your Dreams - An interview with Mr. Isuru Ranaweera (Educator at Avinya)

Q: Can you tell us how Avinya Academy was started?

That's an interesting question, Nawanga. Avinya Academy began almost three years ago. For our very first batch, we expected about 120 students, but to our surprise, we received nearly 300 applications! So, we had to shortlist the most deserving students.

At that time, we didn't even have a proper building. The interviews were held at Sarvodaya, and we organized many activities to keep the students engaged. That was really the beginning of the Avinya journey. After a couple of months, we completed building the school, and that's how Avinya Academy started.

Q: Why did you decide to teach Customer Service, English, IT, and Job Skills? How do these subjects help students in their future careers?

That's another great question, Nethmi. We selected Customer Services because it's a skill that's useful in almost every field. No matter where you work, you'll need to deal with many people and companies, so soft skills are very important.

We also chose English because, through our research, we learned that many of our target students lacked confidence in communicating in English. We wanted to empower them, to help them reach a level where they could communicate effectively and stand shoulder to shoulder with students from Colombo or anywhere else.

Q: What makes Avinya Academy different from other learning places?

think the name Avinya itself means innovation trying new things. Over the past three years, we've experimented with many teaching methods. We started with Project-Based Learning, placed a strong focus on English and Customer Service, then added Mathematics and City & Guilds qualifications.

We also extended our program from six months to eleven months to give students more time to grow. We're constantly evolving to make our program stronger and more meaningful. What truly makes Avinya special is the commitment, passion, and hard work of both our educators and our students.

Q: How would you describe the relationship between teachers and students here?

We're very different from the traditional education system. At Avinya, we try to remove that "gap" between teachers and students. We promote a student-centered learning environment, that's why we ask you many questions and encourage you to ask us just as many!

Avinya is an open space for

discussion, curiosity, and learning. Our students also have the privilege of learning from some of the best educators and using top-quality facilities, all free of charge. This openness and mutual respect are what make Avinya such a special place.

Q: What is your favorite thing about teaching at Avinya Academy?

What I love most is working with students from diverse backgrounds. Every student has a story, and it's so inspiring to see how far they've come. I also love that we, as teachers, learn from our students every day. That kind of experience is very rare in traditional schools.

Q: Can you share a memorable student success story?

Yes, of course! I'll share a story about a girl named Subodha from our second batch. I actually knew her before Avinya because she worked at Pizza Hut. She was a very dedicated daughter who supported her family while trying to study.

When she joined Avinya, she gave her best in every activity. Later, she got a job at VFS Global, a world-class visa processing center. She performed so well there that when representatives from WSO2, one of our partner organizations, visited the center, they were extremely impressed by her professionalism.

That's one of many success stories we're proud of, and we look forward to seeing many more, hopefully from all of you too!

Q: What challenges has Avinya faced along the way?

One main challenge is that some people in the community still don't fully understand our vision and mission. There are a few misconceptions about what Avinya stands for. Some assume our students lack discipline or that we promote strange ideas, which isn't true at all.

We are working hard to build awareness, discipline, and a strong reputation in the community. Changing people's attitudes takes time, but we believe we'll get there eventually.



Q: How has the academy helped the community?

We've supported the community in many ways. For example, we organized a Dansala event, conducted a dog vaccination campaign, and

even ran community teaching sessions for village children and nearby primary schools.

These projects help us give back to the community that supports us, and they also teach our students the value of service and teamwork
